Students in violation of the code of conduct will be asked to leave the summer program and not return.

Fighting or any acts of violence, harassment or intimidation is strictly prohibited. Any student who engages in these behaviors will be asked to leave the summer school program and not return. Any student who disregards these rights is subject to discipline and/or legal action, including the expulsion from Summer School.
2. The Western Suffolk BOCES Regional Summer School reinforces the use of good taste concerning school attire. We encourage modesty in dress and one that encourages students from carrying fads and fashion to extreme. Therefore, see through clothing, short-shorts, soiled and torn clothing are not appropriate school attire. Clothing designed for beachwear, or clothing considered extreme, distracting or disruptive is not permitted. The wearing of clothing that is potentially dangerous to others is not appropriate. Students who are not dressed appropriately will be asked to call their home and arrange for a change of acceptable clothing. Students may be suspended or dismissed for improper attire.
3. For reasons of safety and health, footwear is requirement while students are on school property. Bare feet are not permitted.
4. Smoking is strictly prohibited in the building or on school grounds. Students may not smoke in cars, in parking lots, or on any streets or private property adjacent to school property. Violators will be subject to be released from Summer School.
5. No students are permitted to loiter anywhere on school property at any time.
6. The following items must be turned off in school:
 - a. Cell phones
 - b. Beepers
 - c. Radios, Walkman or other electronic devices.
7. The following items are not permitted in school:
 - a. Weapons of any kind
 - b. Medication
 - c. Large sums of money
 - d. Expensive jewelry
